Meeting called to order at 7:40

Councillor's report - Sean Devine

General Burns Pool - when will it be open and when will it close this summer?

Electric buses - council is pushing more info, will be delays, attempting to ensure mistakes of LRT will not be repeated

Future long-term power failures - will diesel buses be available if electric buses are brought in? Fleet will include both diesel and e-buses. 2036 expect to have full fleet.

Hydrogen fuel cell / electric hybrid buses - tests in Ottawa were flawed - will follow up on whether the City is still considering other technologies.

Ice storm - tons of tree debris - residents were instructed to cut and pile debris. Still not collected. Talking to Forestry Services for an update. Being diverted to flooding. Coming to ward 9 in the next 1 to 2 weeks. Tell Councillor if not being picked up.

Garbage policy - bag and tag. What to do after Trail Road Landfill is full in 13 to 15 years? Options are new landfill or incineration. Both are very expensive. Attempting to extend life of Trail Road. 55 tags a year for a can of garbage or a large item (like rolled carpet). Purchase additional tags at \$3 a tag.

Loose items allowed?

Q: Can regs be changed to prevent dog waste in plastic bags in the compost to prevent plastic to organic waste? Will follow up.

Multi-unit buildings need to be included in garbage policy? Curbside pickup is the largest portion of waste, so City is starting with curbside. Larger policy in the fall will address multi-unit buildings.

Packaging industry? City is pursuing to put the onus on the producer, not the consumer, but also provincial and national.

Can the municipality set up a deposit system for bottles? Set up by province, not municipality. (PEI, Alberta and British Columbia do this.)
